We believe that this kind of long-term partnership would strike the right balance between sharing our greatest objects with audiences around the world, and maintaining the integrity of the incredible collection we hold at the museum."

George Osborne is negotiating a "reciprocal loan deal" with the Greek government to finally resolve the longstanding dispute with Athens over the future of the Elgin Marbles.

Under an agreement being pursued by the former chancellor, now the chairman of the British Museum, the marbles would return to Greece on a long-term loan deal.

In return, Athens would agree to provide the museum with revolving displays of other ancient Greek artefacts, many of which have never been shown in the UK. Critically, the deal would not involve the British Museum giving up its legal ownership of the sculptures, which would require a change in the law.

A significant shift appears to be underway regarding the longstanding debate over the Parthenon Marbles, as the British Museum now openly states on its official website that the return of the Marbles to Greece is a negotiable matter — in the form of a potential loan. According to a report by the newspaper *Apogevmatini*, the museum's website does not reference a permanent return, but specifically discusses the possibility of a loan arrangement. This stance echoes earlier remarks made by Greek-British advisor to the House of Lords, loannis Chountis de Fabry, who had suggested to *Apogevmatini* that such a move would likely come after a change in the UK government.

It's time to return the Parthenon sculptures

n parliament, we are not normally political allies. One of us sits on the Labour benches, the other on the opposition side. One of us campaigned for Britain to remain in the EU, the other negotiated our in the EU, the other negotiated our departure. But we agree on this: whether we are part of the EU or not, Britain is fully part of European civilisation and culture. That's why both of us believe it is time to return the Parthenon sculptures to Albens. Four years ago, talks began between the Greek government and George Osborne, the British Musesum's new chairman, but the initiative gut caught up in pre-election campaigning and stalled after a

campaigning and stalled after a diplomatic spat. The talks about a deal have now resumed, giving us an opportunity to put things back

on track.

The arguments over the sculptures are well rehearsed. They are framed in the language of legality, ownership and blame, and all too often lead to anxiety about whether conceding any of these arguments could threaten the integrity of our world-leading collections. The British Museum is embarking on a El billion reimagination and renovation programme that centres on the programme that centres on the Western Range galleries, where the sculptures are housed. This gives us a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to apply fresh thinking to this age-

old debate.
Some have argued that returning

old debate.

Some have argued that returning these sculptures would open the door to unending debate and demands for scores of museums and galleries to return historic treasures taken during colonial times. We reject that risk. Athens was never part of a British colony. Britain supported and fought for Greek freedom whenever it had the chance. Debates about Greek cultural assets are entirely different from the wider argument about restitution.

Returning the Marbles to Greece is an opportunity to create new, long-term cultural collaboration between our countries. This is the moment for the British Museum to seize that opportunity as part of its ambition to reimagine itself for the 21st century. Exclusive: Osborne says '95% of Parthenon Marbles deal agreed,' but final hurdles remain

British Museum Chair George Osborne has privately revealed that a potential agreement with Greece over the Parthenon Marbles is "95% agreed", though he cautioned that the remaining issues may prove the most difficult to resolve. Greek daily newspaper Ta Nea has learned that Osborne told close associates last week that while most elements of the proposed arrangement are in place, the unresolved 5% involves the most sensitive and complex aspects of the negotiation. "It is not clear when or even if — we'll be able to bridge that final gap," two sources close to Osborne confirmed that he remarked. "We will try, and I hope we succeed." The former chancellor has been leading discreet discussions with the Greek government for more than three years. At the core of the discussions is a proposed long-term cultural partnership that would see the masterpieces of classical antiquity reunited at the Acropolis Museum in Athens, while other significant Greek antiquities would be sent on loan to the British Museum for temporary exhibitions. Sources emphasised that no agreement had been finalised and that an announcement was not expected in the immediate future. ... According to a person with direct knowledge of the talks, the two main points still under dispute are the proportion of the artefacts to be repatriated to Athens and the length of time they would remain there.

Ta Nea can also reveal that Mareva Grabowski-Mitsotakis, the wife of the Greek Prime Minister, has been involved in the process in recent months. According to a well-placed source, she met twice in London with the British Museum's Director Nicholas Cullinan to discuss the matter.

Some museums have objects in their collections that were acquired through imperial or colonial power. One such institution is the British Museum, whose director recently acknowledged the controversial nature of its collection while affirming his intention 'not to reinvent the museum for the 21st century' and closing the door to repatriation. This article critically examines the history of a series of objects in the museum's possession that are currently being claimed by their countries of origin (the Rosetta Stone, the Parthenon marbles, the Magdala treasure, the Benin bronzes) and reviews the institution's inadequate response to the repatriation debate. The article debunks the myth of the educational value of 'world' or 'universal' museums and addresses difficult issues around claims of cultural nationalism and the need to repair past injustices. It shows that numerous countries and institutions both in the United Kingdom and worldwide are addressing the challenges posed by their imperial and colonial collections by repatriating disputed heritage. A case in point is the recent Dutch policy on colonial repatriations, motivated by a desire for reparation. Ultimately, the article argues that the repatriation debate is not about practicality or convenience. It is about justice.
